Lotte Dyhrberg was born in Kungsbacka, Sweden, and grew up in Frederikshavn, Denmark. She moved to the United States in 1979, first to New York for a year, and then to San Francisco. She received a BFA from the San Francisco Art Institute, double major, Painting/Photography, and later studied classical painting and portraiture.

Sharing her artistic journey, she states "When I started working with visual imagery, it was drawing and oil painting that spoke to me. After a few years of painting "re-invented" realistic imagery, I decided to explore other media and I became a professional photographer. After a few years, I felt I was merely a witness to people and events and felt lost. After seeing a show of Amish quilts, my sense of awe and longing for color made me want to explore color and I quilted for about 3 years. Later, painting became my home once again and, although I do not paint strictly in a traditional way anymore, I continue to love the medium of inventing your world on canvas and explore my response to the energy of my ideas. I am currently painting abstract pieces, color explosions full of light and energy. I love starting my work without a concept and stay in the moment, letting the process dictate the direction of the piece. The openness in my process is exciting and refreshing for me, and takes me to places my conscious mind couldn't. I'm mostly inspired by energy of all sorts - nature, kids, music."

Lotte Dyhrberg's work has been shown in Frederikshavn, Denmark and in San Francisco primarily. She is currently working on pieces for a show in Denmark this summer. www.mesart.com
